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CEPF Website Redesign and Redevelopment Addendum 2: Answers to applicants' questions 12 October 2016

- 1. CEPF would prefer to use an open-source CMS, and not a licensed solution.
- 2. Currently, CEPF's grants management system is an Oracle database. In a few months, CEPF will migrate that database to the FoundationConnect grants management system, which will be on SalesForce's platform. There will be an accessible API.
- For web page design layouts, CEPF would prefer to use a module-based approach, but is open to using templates. If we use templates, we would need 6-10.
- 4. CEPF would like to host the website on Conservation International's servers, however we are open to other solutions recommended by the web development firm.
- 5. CEPF has no paid advertising, so that does not need to be taken into consideration for the website redesign.
- 6. CEPF will not need ongoing maintenance for the website. However, for about a month after the launch, the development firm should be available for troubleshooting. And that month is part of the current budget allotment.
