Касательно характеристики горных экосистем Центральной Азии и инвестиции в охрану природы

Уважаемый Оливье Лангран!

Комитет лесного хозяйства и животного мира Министерства сельского хозяйства Республики Казахстан (далее - Комитет), пользуясь, случаем выражает свое глубокое уважение и надеется на дальнейшую плодотворную совместную работу в области сохранения биоразнообразия.

Комитета ранее Специалисты участвовали B консультациях И рассмотрели предлагаемые направления мер охраны природы и инвестиций, рекомендуемых глобально-значимого в зоне биоразнообразия «Горы Центральной Азии». Характеристика экосистем, доступная на веб-сайте фонда (www.cepf.net), основывается на Глобальном стандарте Международного союза охраны природы (МСОП) для ключевых районов биоразнообразия (КРБ), и подготовлена со вкладом ученых и общественных деятелей Республики Казахстан, с учетом регионального обобщения данных.

Указанные в документе основные направления и задачи по сохранению горных экосистем Центральной Азии, включая горы юго-востока Казахстана (Каратау, Иле Алатау и Джунгария), совпадают с обязательствами и проводимыми мероприятиями по выполнению Конвенции о биоразнообразии в Казахстане, в части сохранения и восстановления популяций видов, находящихся под угрозой исчезновения, видов-эндемиков, а также по развитию сети особо охраняемых природных территорий и повышению экологической осведомленности и ответственности природопользователей. Предлагаемая природоохранная инвестиционная программа в виде грантов, ориентированная на общественные организации и ассоциации, занимающиеся вопросами экологии, местные общины и ученых, способна дополнить усилия государства в деле охраны живой природы.

В качестве координатора Конвенции о биологическом разнообразии, Комитет подтверждает важность применения передовых методов и стандартов сохранения биоразнообразия, и считает возможным, в координации с другими государственными органами, реализацию мероприятий по сохранению и восстановлению горных экосистем Казахстана в партнерстве с фондом CEPF и другими донорами. В ходе реализации программы грантов целесообразно развитие партнерства с проектами ГЭФ и инициативой Евросоюза «Больше, чем тигры», которые основываются на ключевых районах биоразнообразия.

Учитывая новизну Глобального стандарта ключевых районов биоразнообразия, Казахстан заинтересован в дальнейшем обмене опытом и развитии навыков применения стандарта при содействии международного партнерства и секретариата по КРБ и фонда СЕРF.
